Be a part of this new trauma Informed and culturally appropriate service, dedicated to improving and empowering the lives of our most vulnerable community members.

Successful Candidate will be of First Nations, Metis or Inuit descent. (Status or non-Status)

YOUR ROLE:

- This role requires an awareness and understanding of the systemic barriers faced by Indigenous peoples in accessing housing opportunities. This includes understanding the impact that the Sixties Scoop, millennial scoop, the Canadian Indian Residential School System, and the effects of intergenerational Trauma has on Indigenous peoples. (TRC calls to action, Jordan's principle, etc.)
- This role provides support and works with community partners, including maintaining strong
 partnership and collaboration with local Indigenous organizations to ensure a coordinated
 approach to ending chronic homelessness.
- Provide culturally safe and relevant supports to residents
- Provide staff support where needed (Fill in, emergencies, sick days and vacation)

RESPONSIBILITIES:

 Provide support and life skill guidance (laundry, meal prep, basic day to day activities) to tenants required throughout various shifts



- Establishes and maintains files both electronic and in hard copy
- Regular assessments of progress and action items
- Housing Search: Create database and keep current local listings of rentals available
- Establish contacts within the Housing community for housing leads for residents to find permanent Housing
- The relief support worker will provide support and intervention to tenants as needed. This may involve crisis resolution, de-escalation techniques and connecting tenants with appropriate emergency services when necessary.
- Light housekeeping duties in the office work area (disinfecting, stocking off supplies, sweeping and mopping of floors, etc.)
- Duties as required

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Must have knowledge of FNMI issues and be trauma informed
- Lived experience is an asset
- A diploma or degree in social services is preferred or relevant experience working with the chronic homeless population in community-based settings
- Relevant experience working with Indigenous populations and local Indigenous Organizations in community-based settings
- Valid First Aid Certificate and CPR level C (Or willingness to train)
- Sound decision making and conflict resolution skills are required
- Knowledge of the local housing market and community services within Waterloo Region
